



Linking a Schoolnet Assessment to a Canvas Assignment

This document explains how teachers can link a Schoolnet assessment to a Canvas assignment. The steps you perform may vary slightly from these steps, depending on the Canvas version and settings.

1. In **Schoolnet**, create a test or find an existing test. Canvas does not fully support the Schoolnet feature of excluding unanswered questions from the score (as shown below). If you choose to make use of this feature, Canvas can be used to view percentage scores, but Schoolnet should be used to analyze points.

2. Schedule the test, and publish the test to TestNav.
3. Copy the unique Schoolnet assessment passcode. You will need it later.
4. Log into **Canvas**.
5. Create an assignment in Canvas. Be sure the number of points for the assignment match the points the test is worth in Schoolnet, and be sure to select “External Tool” as the submission type. A checkbox gives you the option of loading this tool in a new tab.

Checking the checkbox is recommended, but is not required for most browsers (see note).

6. Save the assignment.
7. A prompt will instruct you to enter the Schoolnet assessment passcode. Enter the passcode from Step 2.
8. Click **Link** to link the assignment to the test in Schoolnet, or click **Cancel** to return to the previous screen without linking the assignment to the test.
9. Any errors generated will appear and must be resolved before continuing.
10. Your Canvas assignment is now permanently linked to a Schoolnet assessment. Students must log into Canvas, instead of Schoolnet, to take this test, but results will appear in both applications.

Note: If a student is using Internet Explorer 11 on Windows 7, and if the assignment is configured not to load in a new tab, the student will not be able to take a test through Canvas. If there is a chance any of your students will be using Internet Explorer 11 on Windows 7, please make sure the checkbox to load the tool in a new tab (see Step 5) is checked.
